Executive Summary

To determine an application made by Mr Bradley Barraclough, for of Street Trading consent to enable Mr Barraclough to sell hot and cold food and drinks from a van positioned at 1 Bradbury Drive, Braintree, following an objection we have received from another trader selling similar commodities within 500m radius.

1. **Background**

1.1 The Licensing Department received and validated an application for Street Trading Consent from Mr Barraclough on the 17th August 2009.

- 1.2 Mr Barraclough is proposing to provide hot and cold food and drinks between the hours of Monday to Saturday 06:00am hours to 11:00pm.
- 1.3 In accordance with the Council's Street Trading Policy the Licensing Department consulted will the following:
- Essex Police,
 - Essex County Council Highways or Highways Agency if A12 or A120
 - The local ward Members.
 - Braintree District Council – Planning
 - Braintree District Council – Environmental Health
 - Parish / Town Council
 - Relevant local traders selling similar commodities within 500 m radius of the proposed site.
- Following the consultation we received representation from Mr R Newman, a local trader selling in similar commodities within 500m radius of the proposed site (Appendix 4).
- 1.4 In accordance with the Council's Street Trading Policy – Part 1 paragraph 10(3) where a new applicant wishes to trade in a location where an existing trader already holds a consent to trade in the same commodity the application will be presented before the Licensing Committee for determination.
- 1.5 Within the location of Springwood Industrial Estate there is currently one Street Trading Consent issued by the Council within a 500 meter radius. The street trader is located on Elliott Drive. The location of the existing street trader and the Applicant's proposed site is shown on the attached plan (Appendix 2).
- 1.6 The existing Street trader on Elliott Drive trades in the same commodity of hot and cold food and drink, and trades between the hours of Monday to Saturday 07:00 hours to 15:00 hours.
- 1.7 The Council's Street Trading Policy is attached to this report (Appendix 5).
