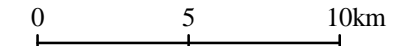


Landscape is a continuum and character does not in general change abruptly on the ground. The boundaries between Landscape Character Types and Areas should be considered to reflect zones of transition in many cases. The assessment was undertaken at a scale of 1:25000, and should only be used on its own to inform decision making at this scale.
