Bra23. Hall Farm Meadows (5.7 ha) TL 696262

These damp grasslands, overplanted with Willows (*Salix* sp.), support a varied flora and represent an increasingly rare Essex habitat. The most floristically interesting areas are the wet ditches and marshy grassland where Marsh Marigold (*Caltha palustris*), Ragged Robin (*Lychnis flos-cuculi*), Wood Club-rush (*Scirpus sylvaticus*) and Cuckooflower (*Cardamine pratensis*) are found amongst Greater and Lesser Pond Sedge (*Carex riparia* and *C. acutiformis*). On the drier ground the sward is typified by Meadow Foxtail (*Alopecurus pratensis*), Sweet Vernal Grass (*Anthoxanthum odoratum*), Pignut (*Conopodium majus*), Crested Dog's-tail (*Cynosurus cristatus*) and Smooth Meadow-grass (*Poa pratensis*).
