**Executive Summary**

To consider the application made by Mr Ben Marsden for a Pavement Permit for the use of the pavement area outside The Nags Head Wine Bar, 8 Market Place, Braintree, Essex.

The Council's Pavement Permit guidance specifies that, if representations are made within the specified period and subject to the appropriate consents being given, the application will be

referred to the Council's Licensing Committee for determination.

## 1. **Background**

- 1.1 In February 2003, Members adopted the provisions under Section 115E(1)(a) and (b) of the Highways Act 1980 which empowers a Council to grant permission to local businesses that wish to use objects or structures on, in, or over a highway to which this part of this Act applies-
  - (I) for a purpose which will result in the production of income;
  - (II) for the purpose of providing a centre for advice or information;  
or
  - (III) for the purpose of advertising
- 1.2 This effectively enables the Council to grant a permit for the use of tables and chairs on the public highway.
- 1.3 The Council's Pavement Permit guidance specifies that, if representations are made within the specified period and subject to the appropriate consents being given, the application will be referred to the Council's Licensing Committee for determination.
- 1.4 On 10<sup>th</sup> March 2009 , the Licensing Department received from Mr Ben Marsden and validated an application for a one year pavement permit for The Nags Head Wine Bar, 8 Market Place, Braintree, Essex to allow the following (Appendix 2);  
  
6 Tables  
24 chairs  
  
Monday to Sunday 10:00 to 18:00 hours
- 1.5 A plan of the area accompanies this report, with the area covered by the application cross-hatched (Appendix 3).
- 1.6 As part of the regulatory procedure, the Council must prepare a notice and arrange for it to be displayed on site. An Officer visited the premises and can confirm that the appropriate notice was displayed in a prominent position on the premises. In addition, notices were also served on "frontagers with an interest", and owner and occupiers of any premises likely to be materially affected by the application.

2. **Consultation**

2.1 As part of the consultation process, the Council must seek the consent of the Highway Authority (Essex County Council), frontagers with an interest, and the Local Planning Authority (Braintree District Council). No objections have been received and Essex County Council has given consent after discussions with Mr Marsden (Appendix 4).
