Bra55. Ridgewell Hall Meadow and church (4.9 ha) TL 741408

This site comprises hummocky grassland with an area of marshy grassland by a stream, which forms the boundary to the south. The meadow displays a wide range of grasses, such as Sweet Vernal Grass (*Anthoxanthum odoratum*), Crested Dog's-tail (*Cynosurus cristatus*), Quaking Grass (*Briza media*), Yellow Oat-grass (*Trisetum flavescens*), Meadow Barley (*Hordeum secalinum*) and Tufted Hair-grass (*Deschampsia cespitosa*). Herbs of interest include Lady's Bedstraw (*Galium verum*) and Cuckooflower (*Cardamine pratensis*). Complementing this grassland to the west, is the species diverse habitat of St Lawrence churchyard. Herbs found in here include Black Knapweed (*Centaurea nigra*), Burnet Saxifrage (*Pimpinella saxifraga*), and Hoary Plantain (*Plantago media*).
