



The map on the right shows the density of Stour Valley South ward in comparison with other wards in the district. Stour Valley South ward has a low population density much like the majority of wards in the district.


Due to ward boundary changes in 2016, we are not able to compare the population count with the census in 2011 and have therefore used the ONS mid year estimates for 2017. The population of Stour Valley South ward has seen a 1.9% increase in population since 2017. The population for the whole district has grown by 5.5% since the census in 2011.

The Stour Valley South ward resident population is 1.9% of the total Braintree District population of 155,220.


The largest age group in the ward is the 55 to 59 year olds and the proportion of males and females in the ward are 49% and 51% respectively.







Modelled estimates of the proportion of households in fuel poverty, %, 2020










Stour Valley South ward has a lower percentage of economically active adults with unemployment rates significantly better than Braintree and Essex.





Stour Valley South - Deprivation



Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) 2019

The map shows the spread of deprivation across the Braintree district at Lower Super Output areas. The most deprived areas are shaded blue, tend to be in the towns of Braintree, Halstead and Witham with the least deprived shaded light green or white in the more outer areas of the district.

Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs) are small geographical units. Deprivation is measured using the Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) 2019. For each LSOA, a deprivation score is calculated covering a broad range of issues:

- Income
- Employment
- · Health and disability
- Education and skills
- · Housing and services
- Crime
- · Living environment

There are wide inequalities between people living in areas of high levels of deprivation and those living in areas of low deprivation; more deprived populations generally have poorer outcomes in terms of health, education etc. All 87 LSOAs in the Braintree district are ordered by IMD score.
