We recently unveiled a strategy which we believe will support and grow the local economy over the next five years.

Our vision is to create a sustainable economy resilient to the challenges of climate change and a competitive one which supports the growth of businesses and highquality jobs.



The key priorities set out in the strategy include:

- Making improvements to public transport and the infrastructure and connectivity needed to attract new businesses
- Offering support programmes to all businesses with additional focus for those within key sectors
- Supporting residents with training and qualifications in an effort to improve skills to mitigate the cost-of-living crisis
- Supporting low and zero carbon initiatives to reduce the district's carbon footprint

Consider where you are currently

Gather your team together to think about your current carbon footprint impact and have a brainstorm of hot spots for improvement.

You could think about themes and business processes to include transport; energy usage, procurement, biodiversity and nature opportunities and adapting to the effects of climate change.

Many local businesses will be considering their policies towards carbon reduction. We have some tips and advice on how you can tackle climate change and play your part, which will also help you save money.

Every action makes a difference as we aim to move towards a Net Zero society. Make 2023 a year of staff engagement for and creating a culture of Climate Change Action.

Think about travel and transport

Every business is different and operates in a completely unique way but do consider if there are ways to either reduce car journeys of staff to and from work or reduce the actual travel within business operations.

Creating a Green Travel Plan for staff is a great start but also consider sharing business trip journeys within work hours or hold meetings online. Support staff by installing secure cycle shelters and shower, locker facilities. Install electric vehicle

> charging points for both staff and work vehicles.



Make staff pledges

Ask every member of your team to make one climate change pledge which they shall commit to for the business year ahead. Support your team to make their pledge measurable, achievable, and personally rewarding and celebrate them too!

Turn down the heat

With rising energy bills over the past year, turning down the heating within business premises has been on most business owners' minds. Consider localising the heating within your premises and using individual thermostats to turn the heating down in areas that are not used regularly.

Scatter some joy

Do you have any outside space at your business premises where you could scatter some wildflower seeds or even plant a few trees? Wildflowers flourish in poor quality soil and take little to no maintenance but can look beautiful as well as encourage wider biodiversity. If you have planters, then consider using drought-resistant plants this year such as lavender or rosemary to reduce the need for watering. If you have a space for some tree planting. then also install a water butt for rain

water collection.

Go paper-light


Saving documents to a cloudbased storage system can benefit colleagues working from home and also save carbon from reduced printing. Encourage your team to consider what they are printing and whether it is essential. Maybe ask vour stakeholders whether they would prefer a paper-free transaction too!



accessed several different grant funding streams, including £20,000 from the Essex County Council Climate Action Challenge Fund. They have successfully installed 39 solar panels to the roof of their Community Centre, swapped the centre's lighting to LED, replaced aluminium windows with double glazed UPVC and replaced a 1987 gas boiler with a far more energy efficient model.

Putting climate change at the forefront of his business plan, Oliver is constantly looking to reduce, reuse and recycle - from rainwater harvesting, to using LED computer-controlled coloured lighting to bring on seedlings, using technology to calculate the perfect spectrum of light needed based on the height and type of plant to reduce wasted energy.
