

HEALTHY HOUSING STRATEGY PUBLIC CONSULTATION

Public consultation of the Healthy Housing Strategy took place between 13th December 2022 and 7th February 2023



65% either **agreed** or strongly agreed on the idea of a **Healthy Housing Strategy**



A total of **246** responses were received



Received responses from:

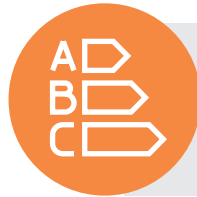
- residents

Received **responses** from all **26** wards in the district



80% of respondents rated 'Reducing the number of empty properties in the district by exploring options to bring them back into use' as **important**, which was the most popular



77% respondents rated 'ensuring all new homes emphasise energy efficient' as **important**



66% of respondents felt that supporting the **ageing population and enabling independent living** should be **high priorities**



Building positive relationships and exploring incentives with the PRS were rated as the least important priorities out of the 9 priorities



69% of respondents agreed that the **style of the strategy was clear**, easy to understand and appropriate for its purpose
