Statement of Common Ground

Between University of Essex, Colchester Borough Council and Tendring District Council

1. This Statement of Common Ground has been prepared to identify the areas of agreement between the University of Essex (UE) and Colchester Borough Council and Tendring District Council as the Local Planning Authorities (LPAs) on matters relating to the LPAs Section 1 Local Plan and the representations submitted by the University of Essex concerning that document.

This Statement includes a table, which sets out the LPAs agreed response with the University of Essex to Section 1 of the Local Plan and lists the areas of the Local Plan that the University of Essex supports. The table has been updated to include the latest responses following publication of the LPAs' 2019 Proposed Amendments to Section 1 of the Local Plan

2. General Matters

The LPAs have worked with the University of Essex on a range of planning and development issues and agreed a Memorandum of Understanding between the University of Essex, Colchester Borough Council, Tendring District Council and Essex County Council in April 2014. The MOU set out a framework for collaboration between the university and the local authorities on projects which would further economic interests and prosperity of North Essex. As a recognised stakeholder, the University of Essex has been formally consulted at every stage of consultation.

The University of Essex submitted representations to the Council's on-line consultation portal for Section 1 of the Local Plan during the Publication Draft Local Plan consultation period ending 11 August 2017. It also responded to the consultation on Additional Evidence Base, Sustainability Appraisal work and Proposed Amendments ending 30 September 2019.

As shown below in the table, the University of Essex broadly supports Section 1 of the Local Plan:

6161	SP4	The University considers that it is for the Borough to determine the exact level of new land, and jobs, needed to achieve these objectives, but it does note, welcomes, and supports, the acknowledgement (para 5.10) that the Tendring Colchester Borders Garden Community, has significant potential to deliver both residential and employment opportunities. The University looks forward to working with Colchester and Tendring Councils to help realise the potential of this strategic commitment, particularly in terms of the opportunities that it opens up for new technology based businesses associated with the University itself. 6162	SP5	The University, particularly, supports the planned improvements for the A12 and A120, which are required both to relieve existing traffic congestion and deliver the housing and employment growth objectives of Colchester, Tendring and Braintree Councils. Most Importantly, the University considers that any proposal for major new development on the east side of Colchester must include a new direct road link (preferably of dual carriageway standard) between the A120 and A133. Without major new infrastructure provision, including highway links, any significant development on this side of the town will exacerbate existing traffic congestion.	Mention of 'strategic highway connections' in 6 th bullet point under Transport could be strengthened by prefacing it with 'new' to indicate that additional links between roads, ie A120 and A133, will need to be provided. 6164	SP8	The University of Essex notes, and welcomes, the policy and supports the need to integrate the new Garden Community with its own activities and development proposals for the Campus and the Knowledge Gateway. The University is, however, disappointed that there is no explicit acknowledgement of the need to provide a good quality, preferably dual carriageway, link, from the A120 to the A133, as an early part of the development.	Add to end of D.9 Transportation — Primary vehicular access to the site will be provided off the A120 and A133. Further road improvements will be implemented in accordance with adopted masterplanning work to appropriately address both local needs and movements between the A120 and A133. Strengthen commitment to University growth by addition of further requirement in bullet point F, Other Requirements Add new section F.25 - Allocation of additional land within the Garden Community to accommodate University expansion which is at least equivalent in size to the allocation in the Colchester Local Development Framework Site Allocations document October 2010.	The first proposed amendment has been made by the LPAs and Is supported by the University. The University noted, however, in its response to the consultation on Proposed Amendments that the second proposed amendment on University expansion land requirement failed to be carried forward in the Proposed Amendments. The latter point will be remedied by Inclusion of the proposed wording in SP8 F.25. This will be submitted by the LPAs to the Section 1 Local Plan examination January hearings under Matter 9.
